Endowed chairs and professorships are among the most important tools in assembling and maintaining a distinguished faculty.

Endowed Undergraduate Scholarships

Temple’s financial aid program successfully helps attract talented students and maintains our economic diversity, it is unable to fully meet our students’ demonstrated needs. Three-quarters of them work at least part-time while studying full-time, which often delays their academic progress.

Endowed Doctoral Fellowships

Fellowships, stipends, assistantships, travel monies and enrichment opportunities are important components of a doctoral educational experience.

Endowed Lecture Series

To increase the College of Education’s visibility and strengthen our knowledge base, an ongoing lecture series would bring nationally and internationally recognized researchers and practitioners to the college to talk to students, alumni and area teachers.

Endowed Research and Travel Funds

To assist and enhance our students’ research capabilities, a research and travel fund would enable doctoral students to travel to distant locations, pay study participants and purchase necessary supplies.
